Mohan Seneviratne has over 26 years of water management, water treatment and water conservation experience. He received his MSc (Hons) in Chemical Engineering from the Moscow Institute of Petrochemical and Gas Industry, USSR in 1980. He has post-graduate qualifications in business management, applied finance and investment.

Mohan started his career in Sri Lanka commissioning ammonia and urea plants.
