E-waste lorry among 5 ditched to evade RTD op

KUALA LANGAT: A lorry driver abandoned a trailer filled with e-waste on the road shoulder just before the South Klang Valley Expressway toll plaza in Bandar Saujana Putra.

The act was allegedly to evade a Road Transport Department (RTD) operation.

Four other loaded tipper lorries were seen parked in the same area, with their drivers nowhere in sight.

One of these heavy vehicles was left with its engine running and hazard lights on.

An RTD officer said in most of these cases, drivers would abandon their lorries if they were foreigners or did not have a valid driver's licence.

Selangor Road Transport Department director Azrin Borhan said the department's Op Paras, which began on May 1, is taking action against lorries that are overloaded or carrying dangerously loaded goods.

"Since the operation started, we have issued 143 notices under Section 63(1) of the Road Trans-

port Act, which requires heavy vehicles to be weighed."

Azrin said 724 overloading cases were detected, and 645 involved goods transported in an unsafe manner.

The RTD seized 23 vehicles found to be overloaded by more than 70 per cent.

Azrin said that overloading is a serious offence as it can cause heavy vehicles to go out of control, reduce their braking ability and damage the road surface.

He added that vehicles carrying dangerously secured loads pose a risk to other motorists if the cargo falls off.

"Our personnel will conduct patrols in plainclothes using unmarked vehicles to outsmart look-outs (tonto)."

Azrin said Kuala Langat is among the Selangor districts with the most complaints involving errant heavy lorries.

Syarikat dan dua pengarahnya termasuk bekas Timbalan Pengarah Jabatan Alam Sekitar (Jas) Negeri Sembilan masing-masing didakwa di Mahkamah Sesyen di sini, semalam atas pertuduhan pelupusan haram buangan terjadual, tahun lalu.

Tertuduh, Syarikat Nature Energy Products Sdn Bhd, S Sivanathiran, 62, dan Chan Kwai Soon, 47, bagaimanapun mengaku tidak bersalah di hadapan Hakim Mohamad Kamil Nizam selepas pertuduhan dibacakan.

Mengikut pertuduhan, syarikat itu dan dua pengarahnya didapati meletakkan buangan terjadual, buangan terlarut organik bukan terhalogen seperti di dalam Jadual Pertama, Peraturan-Peraturan Kualiti Alam Sekeliling (Buangan Terjadual) 2005.

Perbuatan itu dilakukan tanpa terlebih dahulu mendapat apa-apa kelulusan daripada ketua pengarah.

Kesalahan dilakukan kira-kira jam 4.30 petang di Lot 11224, Mukim Jimah, Port Dickson pada 15 Oktober 2024.

Dengan itu, tertuduh telah melakukan kesalahan di bawah Seksyen 34B(1)(a) Akta Kualiti Alam Sekeliling 1974 dan boleh dihukum mengikut Seksyen 34B(4) akta sama.

Jika disabit kesalahan, boleh dipenjarakan selama tempoh tidak lebih lima tahun dan boleh didenda tidak kurang RM100,000 dan maksimum RM10 juta.

Timbalan Pendakwa Raya Nurliyana R Azmi tidak menawarkan sebarang jaminan terhadap tertuduh namun menyerahkan budi bicara mahkamah jika mahu membenarkan jaminan dengan cadangan RM50,000 seorang.

Pihak pembela-

an diwakili Ramzani Idris dan Haresh Mahadevan berhujah tiada apa-apa keperluan dan indikasi tertuduh tidak datang ke mahkamah dan tidak memberi kerjasama.

Tambahnya, kedua-dua tertuduh adalah ahli perniagaan dengan sa-

lah seorangnya bekas penjawat awam.

Mahkamah kemudiannya membenarkan jaminan sebanyak RM9,000 setiap dengan syarat perlu melapor diri di Pejabat Jas Negeri Sembilan dan tidak dibenarkan mengganggu saksi secara sendiri atau melalui pihak ketiga.

Sebutan semula kes serahan dokumen pada 3 Julai depan.
