Mukah Politeknik sweeps top honours in DoE short video contest

KUCHING: Mukah Politeknik (PMU) emerged as the top winner in a short video competition organised by the Department of Environment (DoE) Sarawak, held in conjunction with a community programme on open burning awareness and peatland fire monitoring in Mukah on Tuesday.
